A Bible, a cross and a stole will be placed on the coffin, as reminders of Martin's ministry and faith.

Lord Jesus Christ, the light of world, we walk in your light, symbolised in this candle.

The pascal candle is lit.

Lord Jesus Christ, your living and imperishable word brings us to new birth. Your eternal promises to us and to Martin are proclaimed in the Bible.

Lord Jesus Christ, for love of Martin and each one of us you bore our sins on the cross.

Lord Jesus Christ, you called Martin to ordination, and he answered your call.

Other objects will be placed around the coffin, symbols of Martin's relationships as husband, father, grampy and friend.
