Song during the washing:


Brother, sister let me serve you, let me be as Christ to you; Pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too.

Reading Matthew 26.26-29

Reading John 13. 21-30

Going to Gethsemene with Christ

The liturgy ends with a feeling of emptiness and impending doom. We leave the table silently and move to the church where the choristers sing Ave Verum Corpus by Elgar and we say together the psalms of lament before we strip the church and clear away the meal.

A silent vigil is kept in the church until midnight. Come and go as you need.—bring a blanket etc

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
