Of the Dance, said he.

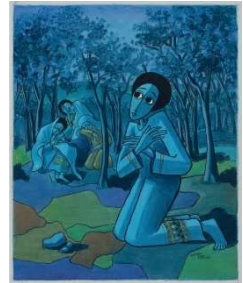
