New Testament Reading Acts 10:34-43

Then Peter began to speak: "I now realise how true it is that God does not show favouritism but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right. You know what has happened throughout the province of Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached— how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him.

"We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They killed him by hanging him on a cross, but God raised him from the dead on the third day and caused him to be seen. He was not seen by all the people, but by witnesses whom God had already chosen—by us who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one whom God appointed as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."



The Gospel - Mark 16. 1-8

The Lord be with you. And also with you

Hear the Holy Gospel according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?"

But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

"Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you."

Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

Profession of Faith:

Brothers and sisters, on this great day of resurrection I ask you to profess the faith of the Church. Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,
born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried;
he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Eucharistic prayer continues, during which we sing:

Holy, Holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the Highest!
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest!

And we say:

Jesus Christ is Lord:

Lord, by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Saviour of the world.

The Eucharistic Prayer ends with:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen

As our Saviour taught us so we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; They kingdom come, thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, the power and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Draw near with faith.

Receive the body of our Lord Jesus Christ
which he gave for you,
and his blood which he shed for you.

Eat and drink in remembrance that he died for you,
and feed on him in your hearts by faith,
with thanksgiving. **Amen**

The Distribution of Communion

Around Christ's table, everyone is welcome. If it is your custom to receive communion in any Christian church you are welcome to receive it this morning, but if you would prefer to receive a blessing please do feel free to come forward and keep you head bowed.

Christians pray for each other. Every week our prayer team is available to pray with you simply and privately about anything that is on your mind, or indeed for another person about whom you care. If you would like them to pray with / for you please go to the Lady Chapel after receiving communion and if there is a queue just sit quietly on the chairs provided

The body and blood of Christ, Amen

After communion:

Father of all, we give you thanks and praise that when we were still far off you met us in your Son and brought us home.

Dying and living, he declared your love, gave us grace, and opened the gate of glory.

May we who share Christ's body live his risen life; We who drink his cup bring life to others; We whom the Spirit lights give light to the world. Keep us firm in the hope you have set before us, So we and all your children shall be free, and the whole earth live to praise your name; Through Christ our Lord.
