New Testament Reading from Acts Chapter 3

One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the hour of prayer, at three o'clock in the afternoon.

A man who was unable to walk from birth was being carried in. People would lay him daily at the gate of the temple called the Beautiful Gate so that he could beg for money from those entering the temple.

When he saw Peter and John about to go into the temple, he asked them for money. Peter looked intently at him, as did John, and said, 'Look at us.' The man fixed his attention on them, expecting to receive something from them. But Peter said, 'I have no silver or gold, but what I have I give you; in the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, stand up and walk.'

And Peter took the man by the right hand and raised him up; and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. Jumping up, the man stood and began to walk, and he entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. All the people saw him walking and praising God, and they recognized him as the one who used to sit and ask for alms at the Beautiful Gate of the temple; and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

While the man clung to Peter and John, all the people ran together to them in the portico called Solomon's Portico, utterly astonished. When Peter saw them he said,

'You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made this man walk?

The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors, has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected ... Jesus, the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. And by faith in Jesus' name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in your presence. And now, friends ... repent and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out."



Glory to you, O Lord



While they were talking about the reports of Jesus being raised from the dead, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'

They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost.

Jesus said to them.

The Lord is here **His spirit is with us**

From the beginning you have created all things and all your works echo the silent music of your praise. In the fullness of time you made us in your image, the crown of all creation.

You give us breath and speech, that with angels and archangels and all the powers of heaven we may find a voice to sing your praise:

Holy, Holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the Highest!
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord
Hosanna in the highest!

How wonderful the work of your hands, O Lord.
As a mother tenderly gathers her children,
you embraced a people as your own.
When they turned away and rebelled
your love remained steadfast.
From them you raised up Jesus our Saviour, born of Mary,
to be the living bread,
in whom all our hungers are satisfied.

He offered his life for sinners, and with a love stronger than death he opened wide his arms on the cross.

On the night before he died, he came to supper with his friends and, taking bread, he gave you thanks. He broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

You are the Saviour of the world.

Father, we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross; we remember his dying and rising in glory, and we rejoice that he intercedes for us at your right hand.

Pour out your Holy Spirit as we bring before you these gifts of your creation; may they be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

As we eat and drink these holy things in your presence, form us in the likeness of Christ, and build us into a living temple to your glory.

Bring us at the last with all the saints to the vision of that eternal splendour for which you have created us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen

As our Saviour taught us so we pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; They kingdom come, thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the Kingdom, the power and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.
