#### WELCOME!

We are excited to join together in this service which is both a legal act and an act of worship. It marks the beginning of Oliver's ministry in Kidlington with Hampton Poyle and a new stage in the life of this parish, for which we give thanks to God.

We welcome Oliver and Jessica. In some ways this is a home-coming for Oliver who was born in Oxford and grew up in Witney; many family members are local. Oliver and Jessica have two grown up daughters: Daisy, who lives in Oxford, and Lucinda, who currently works in Egypt. In his spare time Oliver likes fly fishing, reading old novels, listening to the radio, tortoises (slow) and motorbikes (fast). We are looking forward to working together with him and we want to make sure that he has some time for these pursuits too!

Oliver comes to us with rich experience of parish ministry and community involvement in the UK and Holland. It is wonderful to welcome tonight representatives from Holy Trinity, Wilnecote (Tamworth, NE of Birmingham) where Oliver has been their vicar for 17 years; saying goodbye is hard for everyone and we continue to pray for them, for the process of finding their new vicar, and the next chapter of their ministry.

The Presentation of the New Minister:
The Team Rector leads the new minister to the bishop

Bishop Steven, after due consultation and prayerful consideration, Oliver has been nominated and has accepted to be Team Vicar of this parish. I now present him to you to be licensed.

The bishop addresses the new minster

heart, that God has called you to serve here?

Will you commit yourself to the mission and ministry of the people in this place to further the kingdom of God? *Oliver:* With the help of God, I will.

The members of the ministry team step forward and the bishop says to them

Members of the ministry team, will you welcome Oliver to the team, and work creatively and faithfully with him, meeting regularly for prayer, study and fellowship, and doing all in your power to support each other in fulfilling the ministry of Christ?

Team: With the help of God, we will.

Oliver turns to face the congregation

People of God, will you welcome Oliver and support and uphold him in his ministry now and in the years to come?

With the help of God, we will.

#### The Liturgy of the Word:

#### The Liturgy of Licensing

#### The Declaration and Oaths

The people sit and Oliver stands before the bishop

The Church of England is part of the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation.

Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons.

In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

Oliver makes the Declaration of Assent.

I, Oliver Harrison, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorised or allowed by canon.

Oliver turns and faces the people and, taking a Bible in his right hand, swears the Oath of Allegiance I, Oliver Harrison, do swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Charles the Third, his heirs and successors, according to law: so help me God.

Facing the bishop, and still holding the Bible, Oliver swears the Oath of Canonical Obedience

I, Oliver Harrison, do swear by almighty God that I will pay true and canonical obedience to the Lord Bishop of Oxford, in all things lawful and honest: so help me God.

Oliver signs the declaration and oaths.

The Licensing *The congregation stands.* 

The bishop reads the Deed of Licence and gives it to Oliver, saying

Receive this cure of souls, which is both yours and mine; in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

Keep your eyes fixed on Jesus, who was wounded for our sins, that you may bear in your life the love and joy and peace which are the marks of Jesus in his disciples.

The bishop commends Oliver and the ministry team to the prayers of the people.

The bishop anoints Oliver with the oil of Chrism

Oliver, remember your baptism into Christ. Remember your ordination in the Church of God. May God who anointed Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit anoint and empower you for the blessing of God's people.

#### Amen.

The ministry team and other licensed ministers of the parish join Oliver and they stand / kneel before the bishop.

Taking his pastoral staff, the bishop blesses them

The God of all faithfulness strengthen you for your ministry and in commitment to one another; the God of all grace give you vision, courage and joy; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be upon you and upon all your work done in his name, now and forever. **Amen.** 

#### The Dedication of the Minister and People

Representatives of the church community gather around the new minister with symbols of ministry.

The Assistant Archdeacon says:

Brothers and sisters in Christ, as fellow servants we share in the task of proclaiming the Gospel, celebrating the Sacraments, making new Christians, building up each other in the life of faith, and caring for all, especially those in need. Let us commit ourselves afresh to the ministry to which God calls us.

Presenting water for baptism:

Oliver, please be someone who shares Jesus with people and helps lots of people get baptised.

Together, by God's grace, we will grow in our faith and discipleship.

Presenting the Oil of Healing:

Oliver be among us as a man of reconciliation, showing God's forgiveness and healing.

Together, by God's grace, we will be a Christ-like community of love.

Presenting a Bible:

Oliver, be among us as a man who studies the Scriptures, proclaims the word and explores the faith.

Together, by God's grace, we will tell the good news of Christ to the world.

Presenting a copy of 'Common Worship':
Oliver, be among us as a man of prayer,
offering the Church's liturgy
and interceding for God's people.

Together, by God's grace, we will worship God in spirit and in truth.

Presenting bread and wine:

Oliver, be among us as a man of the Eucharist, presiding among us when we celebrate the Lord's death and resurrection.

Together, by God's grace, we will seek to be the living body of Christ.

Presenting a map, as a symbol of the community:
Oliver, please be someone who builds us all up together
and helps us welcome everyone like Jesus did.

Together, by God's grace, we will seek to be a Church without walls and a blessing in our locality.

When all the symbols have been presented, Oliver responds

I pledge myself to care for the community that gathers here, to share with them the Word of God and the work of ministry, to celebrate with them the sacraments of the new covenant, and to encourage them in their discipleship. Together may we make this a place where Christian people are equipped for their life and witness in God's world.

Amen.

Taking his pastoral staff, the Bishop says

Almighty God, who has given you the will to undertake this ministry, give you also grace and strength to perform it; in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.** 

#### The Welcome

The bishop presents Oliver to the people, saying

People of Kidlington with Hampton Poyle,
I present to you your new Team Vicar,
now duly licensed,
and I invite you to greet him and his family
in the name of Christ.
I commend them to your love and prayers.

## We welcome you! May the Lord richly bless you and make you a blessing among us.

The congregation greets Oliver with a warm round of applause.

Anthem; 'Behold the Tabernacle of God' by Harris sung by St Mary's choir.

Behold the tabernacle of God is with men, and the Spirit of God dwelleth within you. For the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are. For the love of whom ye do this day celebrate the joys of the temple with a season of festivity, Alleluia.

Representatives of the deanery and community welcome Oliver.

#### The Peace

Bishop: We are the body of Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised into one body. Let us then pursue all that makes for peace and builds up our common life.

The peace of the Lord be always with you and also with you.

The Curate: Let us offer one another a sign of peace. We exchange a sign of peace.

#### Prayers of Intercession

Led by Oliver and concluding with:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

### Food For Thought from Marilynne Robinson's novel "Gilead"

Calvin says somewhere that each of us is an actor on a stage and God is the audience. That metaphor has always interested me, because it makes us artists of our behavior, and the reaction of God to us might be thought of as aesthetic rather than morally judgmental in the ordinary sense. How well do we understand our role? With how much assurance do we perform it? [....]

I do like Calvin's image, though, because it suggests how God might actually enjoy us. I believe we think about that far too little. It would be a way into understanding essential things, since presumably the world exists for God's enjoyment.
